Our Mission

To empower youth to be hopeful and thrive by connecting youth and families to opportunities that foster resiliency and success through coordinated systems and engaged communities of support.

What are community programs?

Community programs are activities, events, opportunities, and services that bring about positive community changes, services and supports.

What are community resources?

Community resources are valuable tools in our community (such as people, organizations, and funds) used to improve the quality of life within our community.

What age groups do the listed programs serve?

Community programs in this guide serve youth between the ages of 12-18.

What is the ThrYve Systems Advisory Board?

The ThrYve Systems Advisory Board brings together community partners from different sectors to collectively address factors that prevent and reduce youth violence.

What is the Youth Violence Prevention Center-Kansas City (YVPC-KC)?

Designated as one of five YVPCs in the country, YVPC-KC is an academic-community collaboration that advances the science and practice of youth violence prevention. Through local partnerships, the YVPC-KC develops, implements, and evaluates innovative strategies to prevent violence and create safer, healthier family and community environments for youth.

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THRIVE YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD

ThrYve Youth Advisory Board is for ThrYve participants who want to impact their community and gain leadership skills. There are YAB members from each ThrYve after school program we serve. Being part of our ThrYve Youth Leadership team can positively impact your community and its future, contribute to the success of the program, make positive impact on peers, serve your community, expand your network and meet people and leaders with similar interests and goals.

Our Youth Advisory Board is for ThrYve participants (8th grade and up) who want to positively impact their community and gain leadership skills. There are YAB board members from each of the ThrYve after school programs. They meet monthly on the first Wednesday, including with the ThrYve System Advisory Board to ensure youth's voices are heard when creating programs that impact them. By participating they can positively impact their community and their future. During the summer, the advisory board will meet twice a month.

Youth Navigator Program

ThrYve Youth Navigator program is an opportunity for youth to serve as a peer-leader with other youth. The Youth Navigator is a leadership opportunity for ThrYve youth members who are in 11th or 12th grade or recently completed high school.

Youth Navigators serve as a youth assistant with a ThrYve facilitator or staff. The youth navigator position is a stipend position with ThrYve to allow youth to gain both leadership and work experience. Youth Navigators serve youth assistant for our middle-school after-school program and activities, including helping with Wednesday programming during the school year.

Youth Navigator Opportunities and Expectations:

- Receive certification as a community health worker within one year through ThrYve partners.
- Participate in ThrYve activities and events as a youth peer leader.
- Serve on the ThrYve Youth Leadership Team with the ThrYve Systems and Youth Advisory Board.
- Receive a weekly stipend for service hours.
- Be a leader and help other ThrYve youth members who are in middle school.
- Assist with ThrYve youth programs and activities with members who are in middle school.
- Serve as a peer mentor for other youth to help them make positive choices and have a positive support from another youth in the community.
- Represent ThrYve at community and partner events to share your ideas and feedback.
- Gain professional development training including working in the KU office and also with helping support youth curriculum and program.
- Opportunity to work and contribute more closely with the ThrYve KU and the Youth Violence Prevention Center- Kansas team.

The Community Health Worker Certificate program is open to youth, parents, or partners who would like to obtain certification this summer as a Community Health Worker!

CHW TRAINING COURSE

Community Health Workers (CHWs) serve as a link between a patient and health or social service agencies, working to improve health outcomes by improving access to services and quality of care. CHWs are trusted members of the community and have a close understanding of the community they serve.

This trusting relationship enables the worker to serve as a link between health and social services and the community to facilitate access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence of service delivery.

The completion of this training allows the participants to seek a CHW Credential through the Missouri Credentialing Board or a CHW Certificate through the Kansas CHW Coalition.

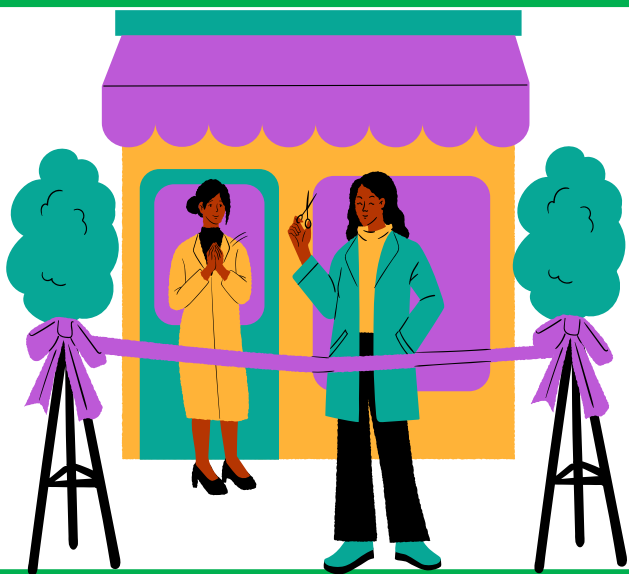

Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for ages individuals **15 to 18** in Kansas. Despite this sobering statistic, Driver's Education was removed from the schools in the 1990's due to budgetary cuts. At PAL, students learn smart driving skills directly from police officers through this course that is certified by the state of Kansas. Officers teach the students the basic class and road courses, and students are required to successfully pass both. Safe drivers mean safe roads for us all! Justice-Involved

Youth and families who have come in contact with the justice system are eligible to enter our programming at no cost. Whether it is the youth or a member of the household, justice system involvement would qualify all to participate.



Mental/Behavioral Health

A new mental/behavioral health crisis would allow for youth and their families to engage with our programming. This referral could come from any of the professionals in a youth's life, and would allow for the youth and their family to receive services at no cost to foster support for all who are working through the crisis.



DCF or CINC

Youth and families that are involved with a DCF or CINC case would automatically qualify for services at no cost. Whether youth are in foster care or the family is engaged in a CINC case, all would be able to engage in our programming.

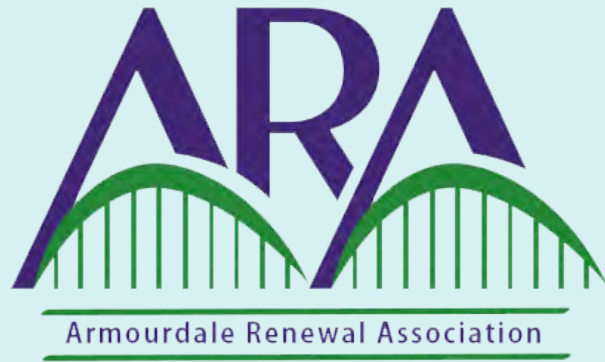

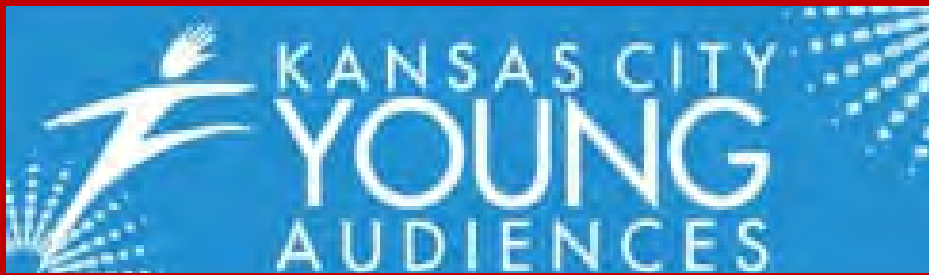

The STAR 2.0 Program provides a hands-on, high-quality research experience during the summer academic break for high school students and educators. During the program, participants get the chance to:

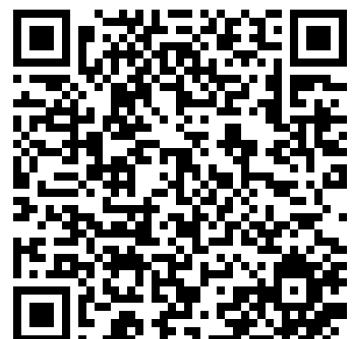

KANSAS FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM



What is the Kansas Food Assistance Program?

The Food Assistance Program (formerly known as the Food Stamp Program) helps people with little or no income. It provides benefits to eligible individuals and families to buy nutritious food, even vegetable plants and seeds, from local grocery stores.

Who Is Eligible for the Program?

- Persons who work but have a low income and those who do not work may be eligible.
- You and anyone who lives in your household and eats with you. Household members do not have to be related to be considered part of the household.
- Able-bodied persons, age 18-49, without children, who work or attend an approved training program 30 hours per week, or qualify for an exemption from work activity.
- Persons age 60 and older and persons with disabilities. Disabled persons include those receiving Supplemental Security Income, Social Security disability payments, certain veterans disability payments, disability retirement benefits for a permanent disability, and railroad disability.

How Do I Purchase Food with My Benefits?

Monthly benefits are provided on a Kansas Benefits Card, or EBT card, that looks and acts like a debit card. Simply swipe your card at

the store when purchasing food, and the cost is electronically subtracted from the card account. You can now also use your EBT card to purchase groceries online at Amazon and Walmart.

How Many Resources Can I Have and Still Receive Food Assistance?

You can have up to \$2,750 in resources. If one person in your household is age 60 or older or disabled, you can have up to \$4,250 in resources. Resources include cash and checking/savings account balances. Certain resources like your home and car are not counted.

Do I Need to be a U.S. Citizen to Receive Food Assistance?

U.S. citizens and certain legal non-citizens are eligible for food assistance benefits when other eligibility requirements are met. If you are not eligible due to immigration status, your legal resident or citizen children may still qualify. Citizenship verification or non-citizen documentation is required for the individuals for whom you are applying.

How Do I Apply?

Applying for assistance is easy. Applications are available at your local DCF Service Center or Access Point, or they can be requested by calling toll-free 1-888-369-4777. Online applications are available at www.dcf.ks.gov. You can leave parts of the application blank if you do not understand how to complete them. Return your application to DCF and someone will contact you to set up an interview. You may request that your interview be held in the office or over the phone.

What Information Do I Need to Give DCF to Apply for Food Assistance?

You may need to provide the following:

- Identification, such as a birth certificate or driver's license
- Non-citizen documentation, if you are not a United States citizen
- Social Security number for you and any household members who are applying for food assistance
- Proof of earned and unearned income
- Proof of assets, such as checking and savings account balances

If I am Eligible, How Much Can I Get?

Benefit amounts are based on household size and income after deductions. If eligible, you will receive a Kansas Benefits Card to purchase groceries.

How Long Can I Have Assistance?

There are no time limits, as long as you meet the eligibility requirements.

PROGRAMA DE ASISTENCIA ALIMENTARIA DE KANSAS

¿Qué es el Programa de Asistencia Alimentaria de Kansas?

El Programa de Asistencia Alimentaria (antes conocido como Programa de Cupones para Alimentos) ayuda a las personas con bajo ingresos o sin ingresos. Brinda beneficios a personas y familias elegibles para comprar alimentos nutritivos, semillas y plantas de vegetales, de tiendas locales.

¿Quién es elegible para el Programa?

- Pueden calificar personas que trabajan, pero tienen un ingreso bajo o aquellos que no trabajan.
- Usted y cualquiera que viva en su hogar y coma con usted. Los miembros del hogar no tienen que estar relacionados para ser considerados como parte del hogar.
- Personas físicamente capaces de 18 a 49 años, sin hijos, que trabajan o asisten a un programa de capacitación autorizado 30 horas a la semana, o califican para una exención de la actividad laboral.
- Personas mayores de 60 años y personas con discapacidades. Personas con discapacidades incluye aquellas que reciben Seguridad de Ingreso Suplementario, pagos por discapacidad del Seguro Social, ciertos pagos por discapacidad de los veteranos de guerra, beneficios por retiro por discapacidad permanente y discapacidad ferroviaria.

¿Cómo compro alimentos con mis beneficios?

Los beneficios mensuales se brindan a través de la Tarjeta de Beneficios de Kansas, o la tarjeta de EBT, que se ve y funciona como una tarjeta de débito. Simplemente deslice su tarjeta en la tienda al

comprar alimentos, y el costo se debitará automáticamente de la cuenta de su tarjeta. Ahora también puede usar la tarjeta de EBT para comprar alimentos en línea, en Amazon y Walmart.

¿Cuántos recursos puedo tener e igual así recibir la asistencia alimentaria?

Puede tener hasta \$2750 en recursos. Si una persona en su hogar tiene 60 años o más o es discapacitada, puede tener hasta \$4250 en recursos. Los recursos incluyen dinero en efectivo y saldos de cuentas corrientes/de ahorro. Ciertos recursos como su vivienda y automóvil no cuentan.

¿Es necesario ser ciudadano estadounidense para recibir asistencia alimentaria?

Los ciudadanos estadounidenses y ciertos no ciudadanos legales califican para recibir beneficios de asistencia alimentaria cuando se cumplen otros requisitos de elegibilidad. Si no califica debido a su estado de inmigración, es posible que sus hijos ciudadanos o residentes legales sí lo hagan. Se requiere verificación de ciudadanía o documentación de no ciudadanía para las personas que están presentando la solicitud.

¿Cómo presento una solicitud?

Solicitar asistencia es fácil. Los formularios de solicitud se encuentran disponibles en su Centro de Servicios de DCF o Punto de Acceso local, o pueden solicitarse llamando de forma gratuita al 1-888-369-4777. Las solicitudes en línea se encuentran disponibles en www.dcf.ks.gov. Puede dejar partes de la solicitud en blanco si no comprende cómo completarlas. Entregue su solicitud a DCF y alguien lo contactará para programar una entrevista. Puede solicitar que su entrevista sea en la oficina o por teléfono.

¿Qué información debo brindarle a DCF para solicitar asistencia alimentaria?

Es posible que deba proporcionar la siguiente información:

- Identificación, como un certificado de nacimiento o licencia de conducir.
- Documentación de no ciudadanía, si no es ciudadano estadounidense.
- Número de seguro social suyo y de los miembros de su familia que solicitan asistencia alimentaria.
- Prueba de ingresos o falta de ingresos.
- Prueba de activos, como saldos de cuentas de ahorro o cuentas corrientes.

Si califico, ¿cuánto puedo obtener?

Los montos de los beneficios se basan en el tamaño del núcleo familiar y el ingreso después de las deducciones. Si califica, recibirá una Tarjeta de Beneficios de Kansas para comprar alimentos.

¿Por cuánto tiempo puedo tener asistencia?

No hay límite de tiempo, siempre que cumpla con los requisitos de elegibilidad.

KC Farm School provides information on selecting your garden site, planning your garden space, deciding what to grow when and how, how to start your own seeds, how to harvest, how to save seeds, and how to prepare food from the garden.
